

Antietam Broadband Cancels Data Usage Caps *Produces Salute to Local Heroes*

(Hagerstown, MD) Antietam Broadband announced today that retroactive to mid-March the company has permanently removed broadband data usage caps for all customers. Antietam Broadband was an early participant in the FCC's Keep Americans Connected pledge, which temporarily lifted fees to customers during the Pandemic. Removing data usage caps, in part, is a result of learnings from the COVID-19 Pandemic as more people worked and learned remotely. During this period customers moved into broadband packages that more accurately reflected their broadband needs. "These are uncertain times", said Brian Lynch, President, Antietam Broadband, "we felt a need to give customers as much certainty over their bill as possible. Eliminating data usage caps means that customers will know the exact amount of their broadband bill every month."

Antietam has kept pace with the unprecedented broadband demand during these past two months by adding backhaul, server capacity and local nodes. "Since the pandemic began, we have seen as much increase in broadband usage as we generally would see over the course of a year, said Lynch. As Washington County's broadband leader, Antietam offers a wide range of broadband speed tiers to fit any household.
